

A FRUIT BEARING TREE OF LIFE

The readings of today invite us to meditate upon our own capacity and fertility in terms of bearing fruits for the kingdom of God on this earth. The call to Christian life itself is a call to crop more robust and vital fruits for the society.



The first reading of today is known as Isaiah's 'Song of the Vineyard', where the prophet laments about the people of Israel who were supposed to bear a good crop of vines but instead they became just like 'wild grapes' due to their disobedience and division among themselves, that led them into different kinds of rivalry and disunity and enmity. That paved the way for the Assyrians to capture them and put them into exile.

The Gospel of today gives a metaphorical description, in that the landowner is God himself, the vineyard is Israel His own Chosen people and the tenants are the leaders of the Israel. The story gives the failure and unworthiness of the tenants and their incapability to fulfil the responsibility entrusted to them by God. They were asked to produce the fruits of justice, truth, mercy and kindness, but instead they created the division and rivalry among the people of God.

The message for us is that, 'Am I capable of producing good fruits for the society in this difficult period of pandemic'? Does my life and behaviour patterns go with the outfit of my Christian vocation? Can I yield more and more fruits of gentleness and compassion, justice and truthfulness at my workplace, among colleagues, in the family etc.?

Let's ask for the necessary grace from God through this Sunday liturgy. May God enable all of us to harvest in plenty for society and the world at large.
