From He Leadeth Me by Walter J. Ciszek

By its very ideology, Communism concerns itself with the question of humanity; to this end it directs all its efforts. No social system in the world gives such prestige to man as does Communism, at least in theory and in propaganda.

There are slogans everywhere that read, "All for man." Gorky's saying that the word man resounds beautifully is often quoted, and children in school and workers in factories are repeatedly told there is nothing in the world more precious than the human being called man. Special expressions in daily usage have been created to emphasise the goodness of human nature. A whole morality has been constructed on the subject, and it permeates the new social order. When reprimanded by authorities or by a comrade for some failure or wrongdoing, citizens are reminded of their obligation to be human, to be conscientious human beings, honest, men of their word. These basic characteristics of human nature are constantly instilled in the minds of children and all Soviet citizens with a fierce insistence. The Communist man, the man of the new social order, must be superior to all human beings, for on him depends the conversion of the world to Communism, to freedom and brotherhood and justice for all.

The goal is to provide for the common good of all, to do for humanity what mankind has never yet succeeded in doing...

Some people were curious and would question me further, some would just shrug, and some would bitterly attack religion and the Church. Their attacks would always center on the abuses that are the high light of all atheistic propaganda against religion: the greed of the Church and how the priests and monks sell candles and icons for money, the sexual perversions of priests and nuns, the political influence and power politics of the Church under the tsars, the weird ascetical practices and penances of "holy men," even the tortures of the Inquisition. Every charge that the Church or churchmen have ever left themselves open to by their human failings is recounted in great detail in the courses on atheism in the schools and displayed in the public museums of atheism. That is the only side of the Church the ordinary citizen of this generation has ever heard about, so his antipathy to the Church and to religion, based on these half-truths and distortions, is understandable...

I talked about God as I believed in him, about creation and God's plan for man and the world. I talked about the Fall and about sin, of man's rejection of God and his plan, of the disorder that had come into the world and the evils that had plagued the human race because of this disorder we call sin.

I echoed Saint Augustine's saying that man's heart was made for God alone and it is restless until it comes to rest in him..

Man was created to praise, revere, and serve God in this world and to be happy with him forever in the next.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

For those who attended the Easter vigil, or one of the Sunday Masses in Lent when five of the 2023/24 RCIA group were formally introduced to the Parish, you will have been part of their initiation into the Catholic Church.

Soon **RCIA** in our Parish will start again for another year. Those involved in helping with the programme always find it to be an inspiring and rewarding experience.

What is the **RCIA**, and could you play a part or benefit from joining the process?

"Becoming Catholic is an amazing, life-changing journey. Much more than a series of educational classes, it moves through a process of deep reflection, discernment and formation.

God offers each of us the grace of desiring and seeking love, truth and meaning. He is the initiator and giver of all faith, who inspires and guides us on our journey. Throughout the process of initiation into the Catholic Church, the people of God accompany those seeking full initiation step-by-step, to support, guide, and help them hear God's call in their life."

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is the name which has been given to the journey taken by people who seek to become Christians and be confirmed participants in our Catholic Church. Essentially this process allows adults and older young people to enquire, and if they wish, to be prepared for three sacraments, Baptism, Confirmation and The Eucharist.

In our parish it normally takes about 10 months, and culminates in personal decisions being made in the new year, a formal welcome by the Archbishop at Southwark Cathedral in Lent and in celebration of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. The group meets every two weeks (excluding school holidays), starting Wednesday 22nd May at 8pm.

Parishioners are asked to encourage friends and relatives to consider joining RCIA this year and indeed anyone wishing to follow the process can be a great help in the Journey to Faith. You will be very welcome to join and accompany this year's candidates. You do not need any particular skills or training. If you might be interested, or would like more information or perhaps have been through the process in the past, please contact one of the priests after Mass on Sundays.
