19th July 2020 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time YEAR A

Taken by itself, the parable of the Wheat and the Weeds, as with all the parables in the chapter, addresses the nature of the kingdom of God. If, as Jesus maintains (Matt 4:17; 12:28), the kingdom has already dawned, why such a continuing focus on evil when it cannot prevail? Or why has God not already intervened to root out evil and establish His rule once and for all?



To this the parable responds that the onset of the kingdom is not taking place on neutral ground. A powerful opposition is at work and it is dangerous to deny it. It too has a powerful hold on the human heart, hence the perceived slowness of the growth of God's Kingdom in modern times.

In Palestine a poisonous weed known as darnel affects wheat crops. In the early stages of growth it looks very like the young shoots of wheat. By the time both plants can be distinguished, the roots are so entwined as to make tearing out the darnel dangerous also to the wheat.

Likewise, good and evil are, at present, so closely entwined in the world as to make too ruthless to attempt to eradicate the one, fatal to a successful harvest of the other. In the harvest time to come, however, God will deal once and for all with evil, before gathering in 'the wheat' of His Kingdom.

OFFERTORY

We have had a number of people ask how to make their weekly offering to church during this time. There are a couple of ways you can do this:

- You can put the money you would normally place in the plate to one side each week, and when you return to church, hand it all in at once into the offertory box in the porch.
- If you are a member of the Gift Aid scheme you can post the filled weekly envelope into the offertory box or through the Presbytery/Parish Office door. Alternatively, save up your weekly offering and then place all contributions into the **ONE envelope** dated for that week. All Gift Aid contributions are entered on individual records for the week they are received and banked and this would save the counters hours of work opening envelopes for individual weeks of lockdown.
