BEARING FRUIT

Last week we were given, in the gospel, the image of the Good Shepherd which expresses for us the fact that God loves us. God cares for us and God protects us. Today the same message is put differently in the image of the vine and the branches.

We know that a well-kept and appealing landscape takes many hours of work. Left without care, the shrubs become unkempt, the grass looks like hay, the flowers become leggy. Cutting back, cutting down, cutting away is what brings out the beauty of a landscape. This kind of work is more than a matter of simple tidiness, It shows that the people who live on the property care. Jesus tells us how God cares for us when he speaks of his Father's pruning us, branches, who are attached to the vine, Jesus. Just as God planted and tended the true vine Jesus, so does God tend us, prune us, so that we, too, might "bear much fruit." God prunes from us whatever does not give life. The purpose of the pruning is the bearing of much fruit. Vines do not choose to be pruned in order to produce fruit. We, however, must make a choice to be pruned and produce fruit.

Taking Jesus' words to heart is what prunes us. We hear his word proclaimed in the Scriptures of course, but his word also comes to us in other ways e.g. when someone lovingly corrects us, in a gentle prod to make a good choice for our life, in a cry for help from someone in need. Responding to-God's word, however it comes to us, nurtures our relationship with him and enables us to produce visible fruit in our lives.
