We hope you and your child enjoyed reading and completing together the chapter 'Lord Have Mercy'. This week, we have started the chapter 'Celebrating our rescue'.

In this chapter, 'Celebrating our rescue', the children have heard how God 'rescues' us when we make the wrong choice. God is like a loving parent. He loves us unconditionally.

The children have heard the word 'reconciliation' and how it means celebrating and making friends again. God is always there waiting to 'rescue' us and forgive us with outstretched arms, just as the shepherd did in the parable of the Lost Sheep.

God will always seek us out to help us if we allow him to, and no matter how we have behaved, he is always ready to give us a big hug and forgive us.

In preparation for your child's reconciliation, which will take place on 1st March, you could start talking together at home about saying sorry and think about ways we show forgiveness to each other.
